# MICHAELIAN BIOGAS: AN INNOVATIVE ACHIEVEMENT

In December 2023, Michaelian Farm, Ado Ekiti made a progressive achievement in generating ‘Biogas’ and ‘Organic fertilizer’ from the animal waste products in the farm. This was a dream come true according to Sr. Celina Adegun, the Manager of the Michaelian Farm. In other words, Michaelian Farm now produces Biogas and Organic fertilizer from piggery and poultry wastes.

What does Biogas mean?

Biogas is a sustainable energy source that is good to the environment and is created when organic materials like food scraps and animal manure decompose. It is produced via a process known as anaerobic digestion, in which these components are broken down by microorganisms in the absence of oxygen. An energy-producing combination of gases is produced during this digestion, mostly methane and carbon dioxide. The fact that biogas can be produced from replenishable organic resources makes it a renewable energy source. Burning biogas emits fewer greenhouse gases than burning conventional fossil fuels, making it a greener fuel substitute. As the gas is being produced, liquid organic fertilizer is also harvested from the digester.

What can Biogas be used for?

Biogas may be used to heat, cook, and produce power, among other things.

- \*It is used in cooking food.
- \*It can replace compressed natural gas for use in vehicles.
- \*It can be used to power generator instead of petrol or diesel.
- \*The organic fertilizer is natural and very good manure for agricultural crops and plants.

In addition, the organic fertilizer is used in feeding fish for faster and rapid growth.

The Future of Michaelian Biogas

At present, Michaelian Biogas is being harvested in a bag that is too big to be carried about. With time, Michaelian Farm hopes to commercialize the gas by compressing it in cylinders at affordable price. The Manager is looking forward into building innovative achievement into an industry, despite being a capital-intensive project. Of course, the organic fertilizer is already available for sale.

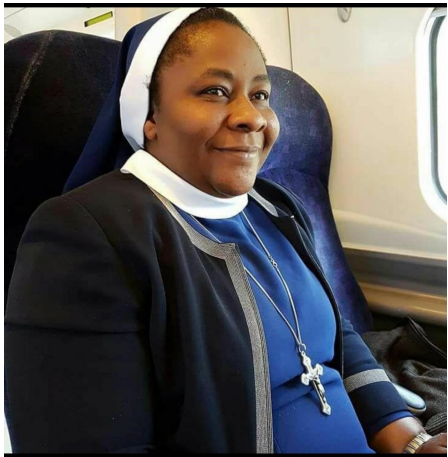

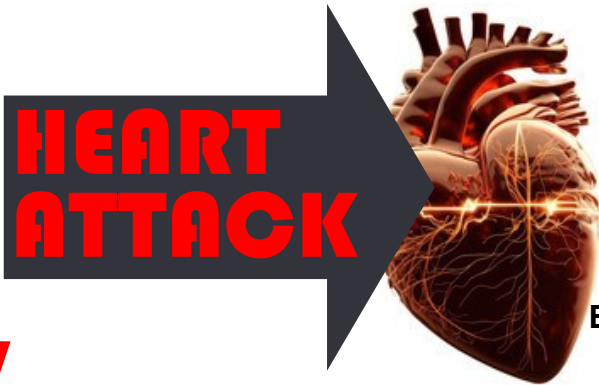
SSMA ADO ZONE CELEBRATES CHRISTMAS

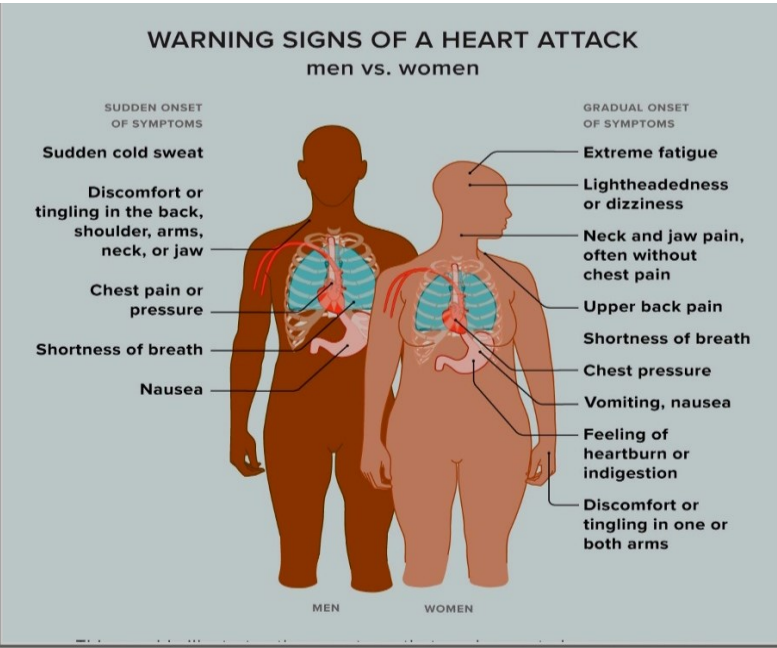
**H**earth attack is a deadly medical emergency. This usually occurs when blood clot blocks the flow of blood to the heart leading to reduced oxygen supply and damage of the heart muscles. It can lead to death. Symptoms include tightness or pain in the chest, arm or neck with associated, light-headedness, anxiety and abnormal heartbeat.

Risk factors include;

- ➔ Age (45 and above for men, 55 and above for women, though can occur earlier),
- ➔ hypertension,
- ➔ diabetes, obesity,
- ➔ high cholesterol,
- ➔ smoking
- ➔ Family history.

Treatment will depend on the level of severity. This ranges from lifestyle modification to immediate resuscitation using CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation), use of medication, stents and bypass surgery.

Prevention is key to its management. Note the risk already highlighted and the warning signs which are pointer to seeking help early enough. Do not delay on this

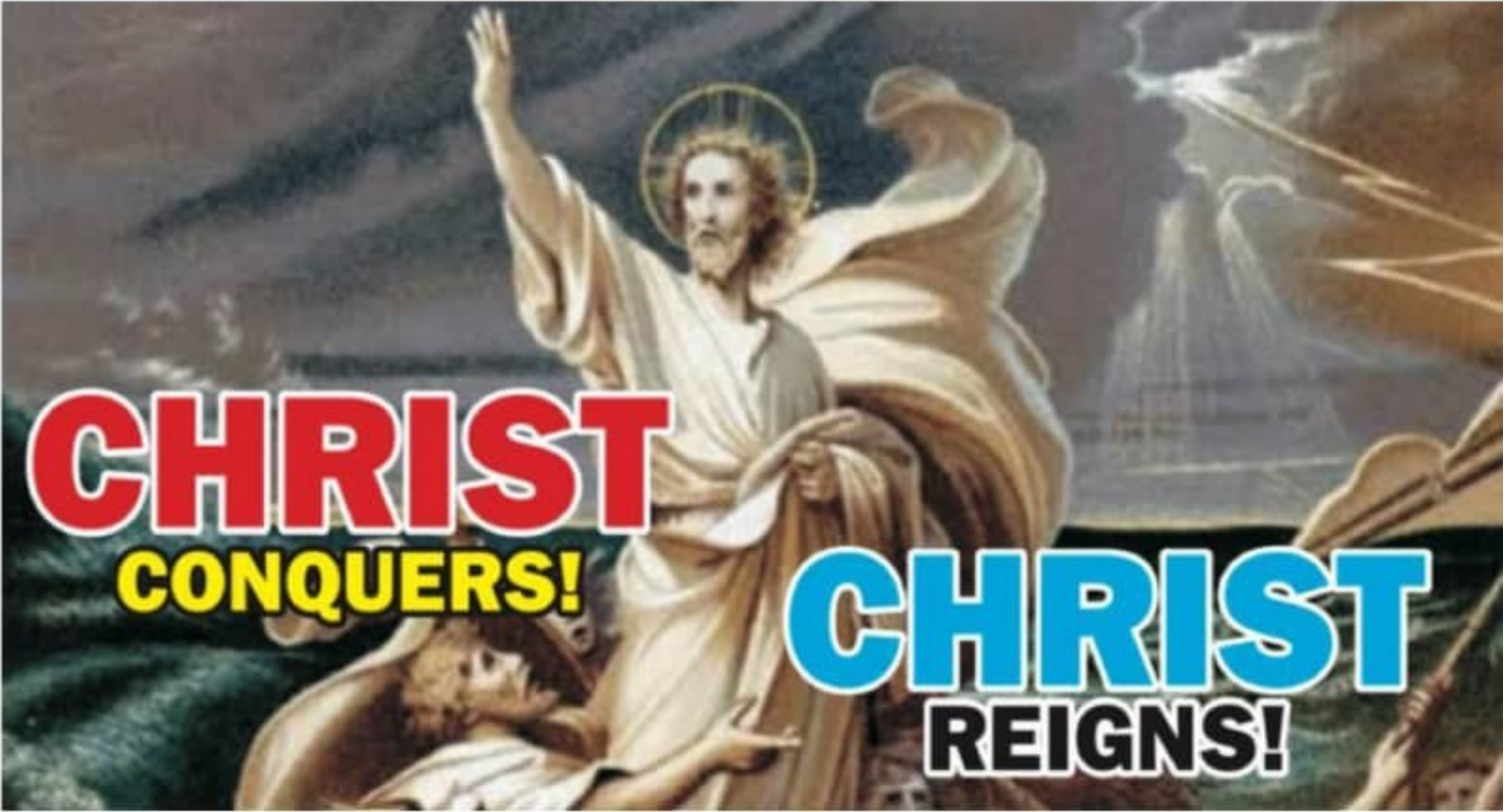
