MAGISTERIUM

The Holy Spirit is a gift that aims to preserve the authentic teachings of Jesus and the Church. The Sacred Tradition, both oral and written, form a unified sacred deposit of divine revelation, entrusted to the Church for preservation and transmission. The Catholic Church has shown keen interest in the development and deployment of Artificial Intelligence, with the Church developing its own exclusive App, Magisterium AI (M.Ai).

M.Ai was created by Longbeard to make Catholic insight and teaching available worldwide. It provides a growing dataset of Church documents, making the Church's teachings more accessible. The M.Ai app can answer questions on Church teachings, practices, and other topics, explaining complex theological concepts in simple language. M.Ai is available in 10 languages and is currently used in 125 countries. It is helpful to formators, teachers, students, and anyone seeking to deepen their understanding of the Catholic faith. The app is also planned to incorporate the entire library of the Pontifical Oriental Institute to make theological and philosophical works widely available. However, human experts are still needed when there is doubt regarding the accuracy of Magisterium AI's responses.

MAGISTERIUM AI

The Holy Father, in his 2024 message for World Communications Day, emphasises the importance of the human heart in navigating the newness of our time. The heart symbolizes freedom, decision-making, integrity, unity, and encounter with God. Wisdom of the heart allows us to integrate our decisions, emotions, desires,

dreams, and individuality. It is found by those who seek it and seen by those who love it. It is a gift of the Holy Spirit, enabling us to see things with God's eyes and uncover their real meaning. Without wisdom, life becomes bland, lacking the "savour" it gives.

The Holy Father also stresses the complexity of technology, its ethical implications, and its role in human development in his message. He therefore, calls for a human approach to technology, emphasising kindness, compassion, and unity. The Pope also affirms the use of Magicerium AI in religious education, highlighting its potential to aid in spreading Catholic teachings. The Pope believes in the potential of AI to reduce global poverty and job losses while promoting fair wages, safe working conditions, and education. Finally, he suggests reskilling future workers to adapt to AI and the changing labour market.
